



Dear parent or guardian,

We're excited to announce that your teen will be taking part in [Money Path](#), a cutting-edge financial education program. Money Path helps teens to explore how their decisions about college, career, budgeting, and saving will impact their long-term goals and financial success.

The program is offered through SecureFutures, a nonprofit organization that our school partners with. Thousands of teens, like yours, will take part in one of their programs this year.

Students will be setting up their personal account on the Money Path website. It is a secure, browser-based website. They will not download anything to a device. They will set up an account by entering their name, an email address, and their year of high school graduation. They will also create a password. SecureFutures does not share this information with anyone. They do not market any products.

Students will make decisions throughout the app related to their plans after high school, but will not enter any personal or private information into Money Path. They will continue to have ongoing access to the program to help them develop their post-high school financial plan. Your student may receive an email in the future notifying them about enhancements to Money Path or to other free financial tools they can utilize.

Students will also be invited to complete a brief survey at the end of the using Money Path. The survey will help the organization to measure the impact of the program. It asks about what they learned through the program. It also asks about whether they plan to take certain actions after the program. The survey will take place during class time. It will take no more than 5 minutes.

Before or after the lesson, your student may ask you questions about your household finances, if they are considering attending college. This information will be used to help them estimate their potential student loan debt and will not be used for any other reason. The information will be confidential to their personal account.

Participation in Money Path and the survey is voluntary. Students may use Money Path, but skip the survey. Please let your student's teacher know if you do not want them to participate in Money Path or the survey.
