Featured Topic: Ways to increase your income

- 1. Look for a better paying job. Search for job postings on sites like Jobs That Help, MilwaukeeJobs, Indeed, and LinkedIn. Set up email alerts so that new jobs that meet your interests are delivered to your email. Talk to those in your network to see if they know of any openings. The more people you have looking into jobs for you, the more opportunities will come your way. 2. Ask for a raise. Ask to schedule a meeting to discuss a pay increase. Come to the
- meeting prepared to demonstrate the value that you bring to the company/organization. Examples of your contributions, accomplishments, and times that you went above and beyond will help to demonstrate your worth. If a raise isn't an option, see if your job is open to giving out a bonus as a reward for high performance.
- Turn your skills/passions into a side hustle. There are lots of ways to do this. You can use sites like Etsy to sell goods you make. You can also look at freelance websites such as TaskRabbit and Fiverr to find jobs relating to your skillset.
- 4. Sell unwanted items. If there's stuff sitting around your house, sell it! There are websites out there such as Poshmark and Thredup that will buy back items for a service fee charge. Some local secondhand/thrift stores may pay for items as well. Facebook also has lots of neighborhood-based groups where you can post things for sale.
- 5. Invest. Investing is a great way to make your money work for you. You don't have to have a lot of money to start investing. You can begin small. Click here to learn the basics about investing. More information on investing to come in next month's newsletter!
- 6. Get a second job. It doesn't have to be related to your current job nor be permanent. Come up with a particular goal or timeline and focus on accomplishing it with your parttime job
