- **Black Friday** is a nationwide shopping event that traditionally begins the Friday following Thanksgiving. Black Friday is one of the biggest retail sales days in the United States and features lots of sales.

# **Upcoming Events**

One-time federal student loan debt relief is now available through the U.S. Department of Education (ED) as part of the Biden-Harris Administration student debt relief plan. You could access up to \$20,000 in debt relief if you received a Federal Pell Grant in college and meet the income requirements. You could access up to \$10,000 in debt relief if you didn't receive a Federal Pell Grant in college and meet the income requirements. There is a deadline to apply, which is December 31, 2023, but you should **apply as soon as possible** so that your application can be processed before the student loan payment freeze lifts at the end of this year. It takes about 6 weeks for the application to be processed. Try to get this completed in November!
